The training was a success as the trainees expressed enthusiasm for the work of Christ in children ministry. It is our hope and prayer that they effectively implement the knowledge and tools to the benefit of children.

Sound Familiar? "A dedication to last throughout the year; It's time to come together - it's up to you, what's your pleasure?" Kool and The Gang 1980. Some of you may remember this song but, for others (too young) it is worth a listen as it can really lift your spirit up.

Speaking of Spirit; how do we lean into our faith to lift our spirit? How do we "celebrate" amid difficult times and sorrow? I am sure all of us can tap into a memory where there was great cause for celebration no matter how far you may need to go to find it. Recall the feelings you had, how your body felt, and the wave of joy that was palpable. You felt good all over. Nothing could steal this time from you. Although why and how we chose to celebrate something may be different for each person, the results are very similar. The euphoria we feel helps to tone down and put into perspective the balance of good and bad as we see it. Any celebration that gives glory and praise to the Lord can encourage renewed focus and joy in the Lord, if we allow it.

God's faithfulness can be celebrated in many ways, but we must take the time to truly celebrate. Not just a quick "Thank you Lord" but a full out celebration that we can feel and gives us a memory that we can tap into and feel the joy again.

Throughout this 2020 season we might find it very difficult to find reasons to celebrate as the challenges and difficult times seem so overwhelming. But we could say, "What better time to celebrate than now?" It is so easy for difficult times to drag us down and create anxiety, especially when the season is long. Yet the season of "Thanks and Giving" and the birth of our Lord and savior are perfect times for us to lean into the Lord and give Him praise. This opportunity to step away from difficult times (even if just for a short time) helps us to regain a better balance of our situation, remember our blessings and maintain a sense of hope and belief in our heavenly Father.

To celebrate is also to bring joy to others and share our enthusiasm. Within this year there have been many demonstrations of people sharing their joy. It is through these demonstrations of joy during difficult times that others wonder how this is possible. How through challenges, sadness, and uncertainty can there be room and

ability to share joy? How is it possible to hold these two opposite and strong emotions at the same time and have joy be the successor? Glad you asked because the answer is; an opportunity to share one of our greatest joys; our faith in Jesus Christ. When we are in unity with the Lord and seeking to serve Him, we are given an inner peace that only He can give. An inner peace that is like no other, defies rationale and gives us the ability to place joy and challenge in perspective. We are not riddled with the angst that allow the despair of difficult and sad events to take us over. The angst that sets a dark cloud over us and does not part to let in any sunshine. A covering that squeezes out any joy there might be and actually prompts us to share the darkness with others. This is often what people expect to feel especially with multiple and prolonged times of difficulty.

So, imagine how people are caught off guard when they see a reaction of peace and often joy in people, they know are going difficult times! This appears so unnatural to them they feel compelled to share some doom and gloom with you just so you have the correct perspective and attitude about your current situation. But, yet again, they are met with responses that come only from the goodness of the Lord and the awareness of their blessings. Right about at this point, they become curious; could it be they have the wrong perspective? And BOOM, here is your opportunity to share the joy, love, and faithfulness of the Lord. Talk about a celebration! What better way to celebrate than to share the Lord and our blessings with others? Now, you do not need to bring out the marching bands and bullhorn (although if that is your style, go for it). Just to have them be in your light that shines through the dark clouds as you speak from your heart is a gift to them.

There are so many verses in the Bible that speak to this topic of celebration during difficult times. I find many of these verses sort of jumpstart my thoughts for times such as these. Here a few:

1 Thessalonians 5:18 Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Jesus Christ for you.

Romans 8:28 And know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose.

Psalm 34:17 The righteous cry out, and the Lord hears them; He delivers them from all their troubles.

Philippians 4:6 Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God

People who have faith in the Lord are often given the strength they need to give thanks and praise to Him despite the current set of difficult circumstances. Yet another cause for celebration and joy! So, no matter what your definition of celebration or how you demonstrate your joy, be sure to lean into the Lord with a mighty heart. A heart that is capable of joy in the storm. A heart that can share the inner peace that only the Lord can give you as you cope with your struggles.

- An important outcome of a crisis is NOT to come out of it the same. We are given the opportunity to renew and refresh through the adversity. We should not be so quick to try and regain what was familiar but to reflect and see what may need to be changed.
- No one comes out of a crisis alone; we need each other. This is one of the strongest messages that we hear from the Lord, "To Love One Another" not just in crisis but all the time.

In 1983, he joined the movement called Sudan People's Liberation Movement and Army (SPLM/A) which was lead by Dr. John Garang De Mabior and he began training as solider and served for eight years in the army. Upon leaving the Army in 1992, he went to Kakuma refugee camp in North Kenya as the refugee. During this time he studied for primary school and attended a seminary at Kakuma Baptist Mission for five days and from there he gave his life to Jesus Christ. In 1996, Elijah was baptized and joined Theological Education by Extensions (TEE). Soon after he attended Kenya Baptist Theological College for four years and ordinated as a pastor in 2003. Elijah is married to his wife Rose Joshua Chen and they have three children, one girl and two boys, Immenuel Riak, Grace Riak and Sunday Riak.

It's my prayer always for God's protection. I fully lean on Him for wisdom and guidance to uphold me to carry on His work and mission. Days are filled with challenges at this time we are experiencing many challenges. Keep us in your prayer.

We are not able to pay the teachers and staff salary for the past several months reason being many parents are unable to pay their children fee since last January 2020 till date due to Covid-19 which affected most of them. The Govt. of India is now putting pressure upon Missions by introducing new Laws to suppress the work of the Mission. A few years back we were being harassed by the Government just because of the name Christian and now regarding the FCRA, I need to approach the Government authority.

The school ongoing projects need to be completed which at this moment the works is stopped due to financial crunch. Information regarding the sponsorship children:

- 1. Miss Lalthisen Mangthang completed her Board Examinations this year very well. She secured 1st Division she got admitted to a nearby college. She is attending her regular classes. She is at present doing well continue to uphold her in your prayers.
- 2. Mr. Jowel Pohshna is now in IX Standard. He will be appearing his Board Exam in 2022. Currently, he is with us in the Hostel continuing his regular offline classes. He will be writing his exam in the month of February 2021. He is doing good by God's grace.
- 3. Mr. Latjanthai Rongmei is now in X Standard, he will be appearing for his Board exams in March 2021. Currently, he is now with us continuing regular offline classes. Health-wise he is doing well.
- 4. Ms. Florysha Rongpharpi is in X standard. She is doing good and will be appearing for her Board Examination in March 2021. Currently, she is here continuing her regular offline classes.
- 5. Ms. Sona Baglari and Ms. Jenny Baglari both are of KG-I Standard, these two little girls were assured by Mr. Peter for sponsorship and they really need it because there is no support from the parent. They came all the way from Mumbai around 3,055 km from Asapalli with the hope of receiving help and support for their education. They have been here with us from the beginning of this year and all throughout the lockdown. There has been no response in their regards from Mr. Peter neither from the parents. They are like orphans with no to support and one care for them. We are all they have now as their parent and family here in Asapalli. Kindly convey the urgency of need to help these two little girls. It would be a great blessing to them.

The following students too are doing well but are still back home since the lockdown started and have not returned yet but are coming back soon to attend their regular classes: Mr. Gaisinthui Gonmei of III Standard, Ms. Happy Lamin of IV Standard, Mr. Jessy Barman of V Standard, Mr. Rahul Shadap of VI Standard, Mr. Sarson Hanse of VI Standard, Ms. Sharon Gonmei of IX Standard

Request you to kindly pass on the message to the sponsors on behalf of those children. I will definitely encourage the children to write themselves to the donors whenever they are free. Right now their classes are in full swing after a gap of many months. We are working on sending messages from the children directly to them and even artworks or photographs of the children.

The positive cases of Covid-19 here in our country is also increasing every day. We commit everything in the Lord's hand. It's our prayer to God to grant each of you good health. May he continue to keep you blessed physically, mentally and spiritually. Community Programs


Women's Ministry


Living the Interior Life

A disciple is a follower of Jesus. He has committed to Christ, walking Christ's way, living Christ life and to sharing Christ's love, suffering and truth with others.






Healing & Restoration



"... I was in prison and you came to visit me." Matthew 25:36




Life Line

An inmate's most vulnerable time, whether they know this or not, is when they are released from incarceration. Months and years, depending on one's sentencing of forced incarceration, are now dissolved. An individual is now "FREE", or at least they may think they are free; however, New York state statistics show that out of approximately every 100 inmates that are released, 78 come back into the prison system in some form. What can be done for the individual who wishes to change? The individual must truly have a change of heart. We can extend our hand and help with that change of heart.

Behind the Walls

In 1985, Braman began to witness his recovery from addiction in the New York State Correctional Facilities. Braman has presented programs since that time in many facilities including: Greenhaven, Fishkill, Downstate, Summit, and several local and county jails. It is a thorough program using the 12 step method of recovery, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and Meditation techniques as well as a program for dealing with violent behavior. In addition, our program helps to provide clarification concerning the negative learned behavior that is unfortunately associated with some families.






